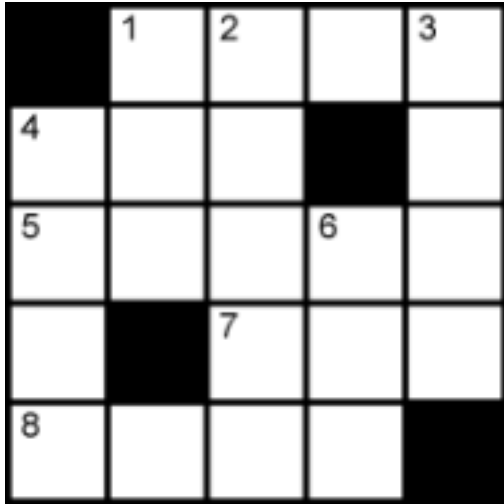

Random Ecstasy

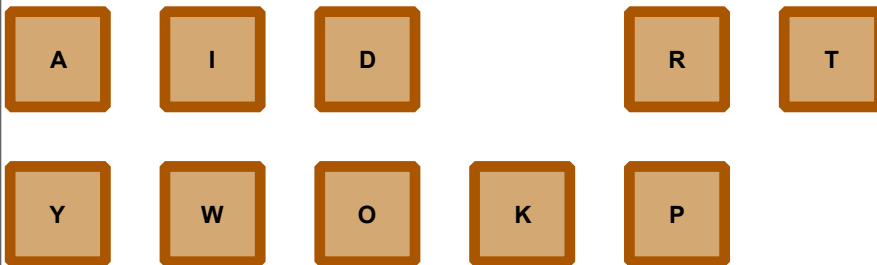
